## NCAA DIVISION I WOMEN'S BASKETBALL RECRUITING OFF-CAMPUS RECRUITING GUIDE Effective August 1, 2011

### **CONTACTS, EVALUATIONS and TELEPHONE CALLS (cont.)**

#### **Telephone Calls During Conduct of Athletics Contest**

Telephone calls to a prospect [or the prospect's relatives or legal guardian(s)] may not be made during the conduct of any of the institution's intercollegiate athletics contests in that sport until the competition has concluded and the team has been dismissed by the coach.

#### **Telephone Calls - Institutional Staff Members -- General Rule**

All telephone calls to prospects (or the prospects' parents, legal guardians or coaches) must be made by the head coach or one or more of the assistant coaches who count toward the numerical limitations in women's basketball.

#### **Visits to a Prospect's Educational Institution**

Institutional staff members may visit a prospect's educational institution on not more than one occasion during a particular week within a contact or evaluation period, regardless of the number of prospects enrolled in the institution or whether any prospect is contacted on that occasion. During the July evaluation period, there are no limitations on the number of times an institutional staff member may visit a prospect's educational institution.

#### **Tournament Exception**

In basketball, visiting a prospect's educational institution on consecutive days during a particular week to observe a tournament or tier of a tournament shall count as a single visit.

#### **Counting Contacts and Evaluations**

Evaluations that occur during the academic year count against the permissible number of recruiting opportunities. Outside of the academic year, evaluations do not count against the annual number of recruiting opportunities. Contacts that occur with a prospect count against the permissible number of total recruiting opportunities regardless of the time period (e.g., academic year or outside the academic year). All contacts and evaluations are subject to recruiting calendar restrictions.

#### **Prospective Student-Athlete's Educational Institution**

Any staff member desiring to contact a prospect at the prospect's educational institution first shall obtain permission for such contact from that institution's executive officer (or the executive officer's authorized representative).

#### **Practice or Competition Site**

Recruiting contact may not be made with a prospect prior to any athletics competition in which the prospect is a participant during the day or days of competition, even if the prospect is on an official or unofficial visit. Contact includes the passing of notes to a prospective by a third party on behalf of an institutional staff member. Contact shall not be made with the prospect as follows:

- a. At any site prior to the contest on the day or days of competition;
- b. From the time the prospect reports on call and becomes involved in competition-related activity to the end of the competition;
- c. After the competition, including competition that requires more than one day of participation (e.g., a basketball tournament), until the prospect is released by the appropriate institutional authority and departs the dressing and meeting facility;
- d. Coaching staff members may send general correspondence to a prospect while the prospect is participating in an athletics event, provided the general correspondence is sent directly to a prospect (e.g., the front desk of the hotel, the prospective student-athlete's personal fax machine) and there is no additional party (e.g., camp employee, coach) involved in disseminating the correspondence

#### **Athletics Events Outside Contact Period**

In-person contact with a prospect shall not be made on or off the member institution's campus at the site of practice or competition or for any athletics event in which the prospect participates outside the permissible contact periods. When a prospect participates in an athletics contest or event (including a noninstitutional, private camp or clinic) on a member institution's campus outside of a contact period, it is not permissible for an authorized institutional staff member to have contact with the prospect until the calendar day following his or her release from the competition. Further, if a prospect is visiting an institution's campus immediately before or after participating in an athletics contest or event on the institution's campus, the prospect must depart the locale of the institution the calendar day before or after the contest or event.

#### **July Evaluation Period**

During the July evaluation periods, all communication with a prospect, the prospect's relatives or legal guardians, the prospect's coach or any individual associated with the prospect as a result of the prospect's participation in basketball, directly or indirectly, is prohibited unless the prospective student-athlete has graduated from high school and signed a National Letter of Intent or institutional written offer of admission and/or financial aid or the institution has received a financial deposit in response to the institution's offer of admission.

#### **Communication After Commitment**

The restrictions on the forms and frequency of communication shall no longer apply beginning the calendar day after: (1) the prospective student-athlete signs a National Letter of Intent (NLI) or the institution's written offer of admission and/or financial aid; or (2) the institution receives a financial deposit in response to the institution's offer of admission.

**NCAA DIVISION I WOMEN'S BASKETBALL RECRUITING OFF-CAMPUS RECRUITING GUIDE**  
**Effective August 1, 2011**

**EVALUATION DAYS**

**Academic Year Evaluation Period**

Evaluations during the academic year may occur at regularly scheduled high school, preparatory school and two-year college contests/tournaments, practices, pick-up games and open gyms. Evaluations at nonscholastic events during prospect's academic year shall only occur during the last full weekend (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) of the fall contact period and the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of the spring evaluation period.

**Summer Evaluation Period**

During the summer evaluation period, a member institution's basketball coaching staff may attend institutional basketball camps and noninstitutional organized events (e.g., camps, leagues, tournaments and festivals) that are certified.

**Coaches Attendance at Basketball Events**

During prescribed evaluation periods, institutional coaching staff members may attend regularly scheduled high school, preparatory school or two-year college contests/tournaments and practices, noninstitutional, nonorganized events (pick-up games), institutional basketball camps and noninstitutional nonorganized events (e.g., camps, leagues, tournaments, festivals and organized team practices in preparation for a certified event) that are certified. The basketball event certification program is not applicable to noninstitutional organized events that are approved, sponsored or conducted by an applicable state, national or international governing body (e.g., intrastate and interstate high school basketball games, state high school all-star games, international competitions and practices associated with such contests).

## NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Recruiting Calendar

August 1, 2011 through July 31, 2012

(See NCAA Division I Bylaw 13.17.3 for Women's Basketball Calendar Formula)

The dates in this calendar reflect the application of Bylaw 13.17 at the time of publication of this manual but are subject to change per NCAA Constitution 5.2.3.1 or if certain dates change (e.g., National Letter of Intent signing dates) are altered.

*Women's Basketball staff members shall not exceed 100 recruiting-person days. A recruiting person day is defined as one coach engaged in an off-campus recruiting activity of a women's basketball prospect on one day; two coaches engaged in recruiting activities on the same day shall use two recruiting days.*

(a) August 1 through September 15, 2011: Quiet Period

(b) September 16 through October 6, 2011: Contact Period

September 30 through October 2, 2011: Evaluations permitted at nonscholastic women's basketball events.

**Note: If the PSAT, SAT, PLAN or ACT is administered on a date that conflicts with fall nonscholastic evaluation weekend (September 30 through October 2, 2011), evaluations at nonscholastic events shall be permissible during the first full weekend of the fall/winter evaluation period (October 7-9, 2011).**

(c) October 7, 2011, through February 29, 2012, [except for (1) and (2) below]: Evaluation Period

(1) November 7-10, 2011: Dead Period

(2) December 24-26, 2011: Dead Period

(d) March 1 through March 29, 2012: Contact Period

(e) March 30 through April 12, 2012, [except for (1) and (2) below]: Dead Period

(1) One women's basketball event certified by the NCAA (Bylaw 30.17) held in conjunction with, and conducted in the host city of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship: Evaluation Period

(2) April 6-8, 2012: Quiet Period

(f) April 13-15, 2012: Evaluation Period

**Note:** April 13-15, 2012: Evaluations permitted at nonscholastic women's basketball events.

**Note: If the PSAT, SAT, PLAN or ACT is administered on a date that conflicts with spring nonscholastic evaluation weekend (April 13-15, 2012), the five-day evaluation period shall shift to the second Friday following the initial date of the spring National Letter of Intent signing period through the following Tuesday (April 20-24, 2012).**

(g) April 16 through July 5, 2012: Quiet Period

(h) July 6-15, 2012: Evaluation Period

(i) July 16-21, 2012, [except for (1) below]: Dead Period

(1) It is permissible for an institution to have contact with a prospect who is enrolled in the institution's summer term (i.e., summer session or summer bridge program) and has signed a National Letter of Intent or other written commitment to attend the institution.

(j) July 22-31, 2012: Evaluation Period

### **Exceptions:**

1. Evaluations are permitted during the National Junior College Athletic Association championship competition.
2. Evaluations are permissible in the following states only during the time periods listed, provided evaluations outside of the July period are counted toward the 100 recruiting-person days:

Hawaii: March 1 through May 31 and July 8-31

All states (except Hawaii) that play the high school basketball season in the spring: April 8-28 and July 8-31
